Reason: This line was last entirely reconstructed in 1912 with Class "B" Eastern Cedar poles for the body of the line, longer poles being used for grade and clearances. The poles are set 41 to the mile and are gained for 4 crossarms. The line carries 19 telegraph and telephone wires on two 10-ft. 10-pin crossarms attached in the first and third gains. There are two additional wires attached with brackets opposite the second gain.

In 1923 the line was storm-guyed by the use of "Never Creep" anchors.

In 1924 the Railway Company attached a 10-ft. 10-pin signal crossarm in the fourth gain for the carrying of the signal wires.
