Reason: This line was last entirely reconstructed in 1912 with class "B" 25-ft. sawn Western Cedar poles for the body of the line and longer round Western Cedar poles for grading and clearances. The poles were set 41 per mile.

The line carries 29 telegraph and telephone wires on three 10-ft. crossarms which are attached in the first, third and fourth gains. There is also an average of 31 automatic signal wires carried on 10-ft. crossarms attached in the fifth gain.

The arms in the first and third gains are owned jointly by the Northern Pacific and the Western Union; those in the fourth gain are owned jointly by the Northern Pacific and the OWR&N; the signal arms are owned exclusively by the Northern Pacific.
