Location: BETWEEN WOODINVILLE & SUMAS, WASHINGTON. Supplementary A

Title: HEAVY REPAIRS & RECONSTRUCTION OF TELEGRAPH LINE.

Reason: This joint Northern Pacific-Western Union pole line was constructed in 1914 and 1915. Between Woodinville and Sedro Woolley the line carries 10 wires attached on two 10-ft. 10-pin crossarms. Between Sedro Woolley and Wickersham the line carries three wires; and between Wickersham and Sumas it carries two wires. North of Sedro Woolley there is but one 10-ft. 10-pin crossarm attached for the entire distance.

Between Woodinville and M.P. 38 near Snohomish the body of the pole line is constructed of class "B" Oregon Sawn Cedar Poles, the longer poles generally being round Western Cedar.

North of Sedro Woolley and extending into Sumas the body of the line consists principally of 22-ft. Oregon sawn cedar poles, the longer poles being round Western Cedar.
