Reason: The Telephone dispatching circuits on the Yellowstone Division west of Glendive were designed and equipped to work as two separate circuits; one from Glendive to Forsyth, and one from Glendive to Billings with no offices connected to it between Glendive and Forsyth.

Since they were constructed, the fourth sub-division circuit was extended from Billings to Laurel and later the dispatching districts were changed so that one set of dispatchers work the entire line between Glendive and Laurel on one circuit with all offices cut in.

There are also several section houses, some signal mainainer's houses and numerous booths out in on the line. The result is that the transmission is not good from one end of the circuit to the other when more than three or four receivers are off the hooks at the same time.

A type of telephone equipment known as the W.E. No. 501 set has been developed which the manufacturers (The Western Electric Company) state will remedy the difficulty and it is proposed to substitute this type for the existing telephone sets.
