

SECTION FOREMAN'S REPORT OF STOCK KILLED.

INSTRUCTIONS TO SECTION FOREMEN.

When stock is killed or injured on your section, fill out this blank Form 517 at once and send to superior officer.

Give the value of each animal killed as nearly as you can. Avoid placing the price too high or low.

Always notify owner of stock killed or injured as soon as possible so he can identify it, and if injured take care of it. The Company desires the owner of stock killed or injured to dispose of it to the best advantage, saving the hide, and when possible, the meat.

When owner refuses to take an injured animal, section foreman must dispose of it as best he can. If badly injured it should be killed.

When owner refuses to take charge of an animal that has been killed by a train, foreman must bury same.

Special instructions to Section FOREMEN in Montana: Chapter 99 of the 1919 Session Laws of Montana requires that all animals be skinned and shall preserve the whole of hide, or as much as can be preserved, including the head and ears. Hides on N. P. shall be shipped to Agent at Billings or Missoula, according to location.

When foreman removes a hide (except in Montana) or sells a carcass, cash proceeds should be sent by Railway Express to the Treasurer, N. P. Ry. Co., St. Paul, Minn., with letter of explanation.
