Dear Mrs. Angle:

We are sending Mr. Wiggins home much improved. He has gained weight and his diabetes is well controlled on a general diet from which sweets have been eliminated. He is taking 15 units of Protomine Zinc Insulin a day.

He has had a chronic urinary tract infection secondary to an urinary obstruction due to his enlarged prostate. This condition has temporarily been cleared up with antibiotics but I feel it will almost certainly recur as long as his prostate obstructs the passage of urine as it now does. We have therefore recommended that he have a transurethral prostatectomy which would have to be done at the St. Paul Hospital. We believe he is now in condition to stand that type of procedure. However, he has refused to have the surgery.

He has been otherwise very cooperative and has been a good patient since he has been feeling better.
